Unit 6: Poetry Portfolio

Compose a poem on a major, meaningful theme using poetic techniques, figurative language, and graphic elements.

Poems must have at least 8 lines. Try to keep the poem length to one page, and break long poems into stanzas. Stanzas should be single spaced, with a blank line between stanzas.

Themes are overarching ideas or author's message that usually can be expressed in a noun phrase or short "lesson learned" sentence. Some examples of themes are:

- Acceptance of self
 - Man's responsibility to society
 - Reaction to an event/situation
 - Consequences of an action
 - •Beauty of a scene in nature
 - •A moment of insight

- The journey to adulthood
- Impact of loss of loved one
- Man's inhumanity to man
- Reconciliation between friends
